Introduction

As of 2008, less than 2% of Americans are directly employed in agriculture. However, those 2% are responsible for \$216.9 billion of production. They don't do it alone. Many other industries support agriculture – keeping machinery running, designing and building farm buildings and equipment, advertising and promoting agriculture and its products, and using the material produced.

Assignment

In this activity you will be brainstorming ways that different CTE programs support agriculture. On the back are two possible layouts – you are welcome to come up with others. However, it needs to be organized and graphic in nature.

Under each career cluster, write in the MCTI programs that you believe apply. There is at least one program per cluster.

For each MCTI program, write a sentence describing how that program might support agriculture – how someone who graduates that program might find a job on a farm, in an aquaculture facility, at a food processing plant, with a landscape and garden center, etc. Be specific. A good example is "HVAC technicians maintain the freezers and refrigerators associated with packing plants". A bad example is plumbers work on farms.

For each program represented by your group, write a 5-sentence paragraph about how your program specifically supports agriculture. Be creative – there are lots of cool ways your programs are related to agriculture.

You may work in groups of 1 – 3.
